

Golf Tournament Fundraiser

The 34th Annual TRRC Golf Classic was held this month on Tuesday, September 10th at Queenstown Harbor. Funds raised will largely serve to fortify the center's 2025 budget for equine and program expenses. Occupational therapist, April Odendahl, of Children Matter – Therapy 4 Kids shared a video presenation and spoke about the healing nature of horses in equine-assisted therapy services.

Maryland Horse Industry Board Meeting at TRRC.

The Maryland horse industry board met for their monthly meeting in the bank barn on Thursday. September 12. The purpose of the Maryland Horse Industry Board (MHIB) is "to promote equestrian activities and the use of horses for recreation through promotional activities that create awareness and visibility for the equine industry, educational and research projects to benefit the equine industry, and developmental efforts, such as job training programs, facilities planning and export marketing to stimulate the growth of the local horse economy" (Maryland Dept. of Agriculture, 2024). The monthly meetings are open to the public and TRRC had an opportunity to share the uniqueness of the center with the local horse community.

New Arena - A Dream to Serve.

In 2018, TRRC started the process of building a new arena that was slightly removed from the original indoor space to provide services to children and adults that needed a more secluded and quiet setting to do their equine assisted therapy visits.

This arena is almost ready to be used and we'd love to see the space fully realized for all of its potential! This space could be a treatment space for veterans receiving therapy or children with sensory needs. We are looking for funding opportunities and generous donors to help us finish this project!

Becca Buffet-Staggs





VOLUNTEER CLASSES with Becca

Becca will be teaching the following volunteer classes. If you're available to attend, we highly recommend!!

- PATH Safety Training Sunday, September 29 @ 5pm and Tuesday, October 1 @ 4pm Great for volunteers who like to sidewalk. We will be covering: Assisted mounting, helmet fit, emergency dismount, side walking, and tack checks.
- Ground Training Sunday, October 6 @ 5pm and Tuesday, October 8 @ 4pm
 Great for volunteers who like to help take care of the horses in the barn. We will be covering: saddle placement, English v. Western tack, Halter v. Bridle, and teaching Ground Manners to your horse.
- The Focused Stand Sunday, October 13 @ 5pm and Tuesday, October 15 @ 4pm Great for volunteers who like to lead. We will be covering: lead line safety, Word first ground manners, focused stand training, and lesson expectations.



Announcements!

Check your helmets!!

Did you know your riding helmet has an expiration date? Helmets need to be replaced every 5 years due to safety precautions as materials and normal wear can degrade the protective qualities of the helmet over time. To check your expiration date, look on the inside of your helmet under the padding. There typically is a sticker on the inside that will have the expiration date printed on it. If your helmet is expired, you will need to replace your helmet before your next riding lesson.
